Where did we get these numbers?

These figures are derived from the direct voting of the members of the LSTA review committee. Individual grants are scored and each committee member assigns a numerical value to the grant and the total of all these numbers is the *Total*. The *Total* number was divided by the number of reviewers who voted on the project. Note: some abstentions were recorded during the voting process..

These rankings are from the review meeting held on January 21, 2009. The rankings are provided to the State Library Administrator. Actual awards can only be made after the U.S. Congress finalizes the budget and the state allotments are determined by the Federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB).
